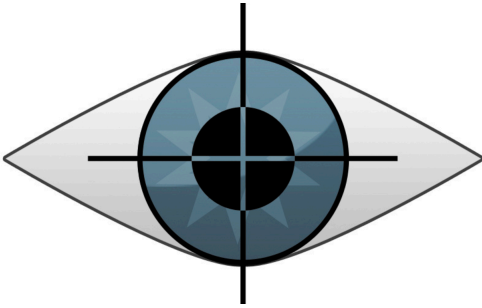


# Are you 50 or over? If so, we want your help!

## Adults with and without Parkinson's disease are wanted



What can your eyes tell us?

### We invite you to participate if you:

- Are between 50 and 90 years old.
- Are a native English speaker.
- Completed grade 10, or higher, in school.
- Are able to attend two study visits.
- Have no history of major psychiatric illness, brain injury/disease (other than Parkinson's disease).
- Have no significant difficulties reading or hearing. Individuals who wear hearing aids and glasses may be eligible for the study.
- Do not have an active contagious skin infection involving the face (e.g., shingles) or eye infection (e.g., conjunctivitis)

## What we are asking of you?

- Come to our lab, located at Northwestern University in Evanston, IL, to complete the study.
- Complete a testing battery of your thinking, memory, language, and hearing abilities.
- Complete an eyetracking experiment where you listen to sentences while looking at pictures on a computer screen. A special camera will track your eye movements while you listen.
- By participating in the study, you will help inform our understanding of language problems in Parkinson's disease.
- You will be compensated for your participation in this study.
- Parking is provided.
